



MOTH ORCHIDS, *PHALAENOPSIS*,

- Best home orchid
- Bloom season late winter into spring
- Bright window light
- Temperature range 60 at night to 85 degrees F daytime temp
- Water in the morning, then allow to dry



MINIATURE CORSAGE ORCHIDS, CATTLEYA

- Popular home orchid
- Bloom time depends on variety, but most commonly in winter
- Bright light but no direct midday sun
- Temperature range 60 at night to 85 degrees F daytime temp
- Dry thoroughly between waterings; keep humidity as high as possible





Princess Alexandra's orchid

Oncidium,

- A bit fussier than the preceding two
- Flowers year-round
- Favors an east or west window
- Prefers a slightly cooler environment
- Medium should dry halfway between waterings, but do not drench



PANSY ORCHID, *MILTONIA*

- Becoming more popular as people discover them
- Flowers in the summer
- Needs relatively shaded light
- Prefers cooler temperatures
- Does not want to completely dry out but do not drown
- Needs high humidity
- Especially fragrant at mid-day
